The Messy Church Course



Why a Messy Church Course?

This Course was developed to teach and in-service lay people and clergy who are looking for ways to reach families in their communities who are not part of a local church. In the past, workshops were effective for training but only to a very limited degree due to the vast distances for travel, the small number of instructors and the availability/cost of providing a training venue and accompanying expenses.

Who is this course for?

- Missional leaders and ministry pioneers exploring new ways of being church in their communities
- Those who are exploring and/or wanting to start a Messy Church in their community
- Current Messy Church leaders and practitioners
- Denominational and church/parish leadership
- Anyone who wants an in depth understanding of the theory and praxis of Messy Church

Course Description

The course consists of six modules focusing on six areas pertinent to learning about Messy Church. We suggest that students work through the modules in order. Everything included in the course relates to Messy Church including how we look at each topic. There are visuals, video clips, lots of concrete examples and links to additional information and resources.

Module 1 Family Faith Formation
