<b>Call to Order</b>	Erica Wiebe called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm and led us in our Land Acknowledgment. Erica Wiebe led our opening reflection and prayer.
<b>Agenda</b>	We reviewed the agenda as distributed.
<b>Minutes 015– 2022/2023</b>	<b>It was agreed by consensus: That Prairie to Pine Regional Council Executive approve the September 6, 2022 minutes as distributed.</b>
<b>BUSINESS ARISING</b>	
<b>Treasurer</b>	Nominations hasn't found anyone yet. Encourage people to look for people that you think would be good. Important position, so any leads please pass them on to Nomination.
<b>Free Press advisory board</b>	We still need to connect with Teresa Moysey to see if this is worth the amount we put in the budget.  Julie spoke to Teresa, she hasn't been to a meeting of the full group, they don't meet very often. Teresa indicated that she will contact Julie once they have a meeting. Elizabeth Brown is also there as a Congregational representative and raised some concerns.
<b>Structure Document</b>	The document was shared with everyone last meeting. Are people ready for it to be approved? Pat will check with each of the committees/commissions to see if it accurately reflects their basic structure.  The Structure document committee will meet again to clarify the purpose of the document and if there are further documents needed.
<b>NEW BUSINESS</b>	
<b>Draft Budget</b>	<b>Heather Dootoff reported:</b>

We reviewed the draft budget. Still not clear on what the cost of living increase will be, 3.2% or 3.4%. The current travel rate for Regional Council work is \$0.30 per km. The General Council rate is going to be \$0.55 in 2023.

### **Mission Support**

The Mission Support Grant Committee members received grant applications from 5 applicants for the 2023 funding period.

All applications were from groups we have funded in previous years and almost all have asked for funding similar to previous years. Our struggle this year was 1Just City's application, which had a significantly higher funding request due to rising staffing needs.

West Broadway Community Ministry has recently come under the Incorporated umbrella of 1Just City administration.

Our budget for each funding year has stayed fairly consistently at \$126,000. This does not allow us to increase funding to any applicants without taking away from others.

After much discussion, our recommendation to the Prairie to Pine Regional Council Executive is:

- 1) That the funding budget be increased to \$129,000
- 2) That funds be awarded to each applicant in these amounts:
  - Rock Lake Camp \$ 5,500
  - Wellman Lake Camp \$ 4,000
  - The Counselling Centre \$ 8,000
  - Sandy Saulteaux Spiritual Centre \$ 1,500
  - 1Just City \$110,000

Yaay had their first in person meeting since Covid began. Planning is happening for the Alf meeting.

Sharing Across Cultures retreat happened for BIPOC youth, there were about 20 participants. Cultural games, food from five different cultures was shared. Youth learned how to prepare the food and then they ate it for meals. There were cultural dancing and drumming. It is hoped that we can have another event again next year.

Lilja attended the World Council of Churches Assembly as a steward. It was an exciting and interesting experience. Connected with a lot of youth from around the world.

## STAFF REPORTS

### Executive Minister

Shannon McCarthy reported:

A Tri-Regional Staff Gathering happened in September. It was good to have all the staff in one place and to talk about some larger vision pieces.

Shannon also attended an Executive Minister's gather and the Senior Leaders gathering in Toronto.

The job posting for Shannon's admin support position is posted and closes towards the end of October.

### Pastoral Relations Minister

Judy Hare reported:

Our Regional Council has a new OV Minister: Laura Fohse

We currently have a high number of retired ministers who are palliative or have died recently.

Sending out information about gathering together to active ministry personnel and retired personnel to see if they would like to gather, despite ongoing pandemic.

Shifted to online training for search committees.

Currently have 8 churches in the city of Winnipeg searching for Ministry Personnel.

Pastoral Relations Ministers are gathering in Montreal in November. Looking forward to connecting. One of the areas of particular focus is regarding the Admissions process.




