Guide for Fossil Fuel Divestment Conversations with Financial Institutions

In the fight against climate change, it is vital that all financial institutions become aware that their members are concerned about continuing investments in the fossil industry and particularly in fossil fuel expansion (ie. building pipelines that are a huge upfront investment and will depend on many years of fossil fuel extraction to pay off investors!)

For that reason, we are hoping you will initiate a conversation with your financial institution about their priorities when it comes to investing your money. Be clear that you or your congregation will consider moving your investments away from support for fossil fuels. We provide you with some basic questions below to help guide your conversation.

Before approaching your financial institution, we encourage you to read <u>The United Church of Canada's Responsible Investing Guiding Principles</u> and have a discussion about what these mean for you or your congregation when it comes to the environment/climate. You may also want to familiarize yourself with <u>Banking on Climate Chaos</u> so you are aware of the extent of the money being poured into a variety of non-sustainable activities. While information about banks and their investments in fossil fuels is more readily available, less is known about the various credit unions' practices. It is our hope to gather more details about the banks, and credit unions in particular, as well as to have an indication of how many churches and individuals are taking part in this action.

We invite you to contribute to the research. Here is a PDF you can print out, so that you have the questions and a space for note taking in front of you and aren't relying on your screen. And, we would appreciate receiving information and your personal thoughts after the conversation.
